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DRC RECEIVES 21ST AND 22ND TASK ORDERS UNDER THE AIR FORCE'S DESIGN AND ENGINEERING SUPPORT PROGRAM WORTH \$4.0M

ANDOVER, Mass. – June 28 , 2010 – DRC (NASDAQ: DRCO) today announced that it received its 21st and 22nd task orders under the Air Force's Design and Engineering Support Program (DESP II) contract. The first task order is the C/KC-135 Technical Order Systems Malfunction Analysis and Consolidation (TOSMAC) Program is a two-year contract with a projected total value of \$1.32M effort, awarded through Oklahoma City Air Logistics Center at Tinker Air Force Base, OK, involves improving the quality and usability of C/KC-135 technical orders that materially influence C/KC-135 aircraft mission readiness and on improving maintenance practice effectiveness and safety. The second award was the Space & C3I Weapons Systems Support Program which is a two-year program worth \$2.7M at Ogden Air Logistics Center.

Under the terms of the first task order, which has a 24-month basic period of performance, DRC and subcontractor General Atomics (GA) will analyze existing C/KC-135 system malfunction logic trees and to provide updates and/or to develop new logic tree procedures. The DRC team will consolidate and update the C/KC-135 Maintenance series technical orders prior to digitization and to develop new checklist type technical orders to support safe and efficient ground handling of aircraft. The DRC team will accomplish analyses of the C/KC-135 technical order consolidation work being accomplished to ensure that technically accurate and comprehensive consolidated technical orders are being produced. The contract work will be done by DRC's and GA's Utah offices in support of the C/KC-135 System Program Office at Tinker AFB OK. Under the second task order DRC will provide A&AS support for the Space & C3I weapons systems. "DRC is pleased to participate in this leading-edge program, and looks forward to supporting the Air Force Depots with the full range of our technical capabilities," said Robert L. Smith, senior vice president and general manager of DRC's Acquisition Management and Engineering Group.
